Describe the extent and nature of enforcement authority for campus security authority personnel.

The Public Safety Department reports directly to the president of the University. Public Safety works closely with all departments of the University. Public Safety provides information, review, and consultation in a confidential manner to all faculty, and staff. The office is located in the Condit Hall residence building. There are 24 hours a day, 365 days a year Uniformed Public Safety officers, a supervisor, and a director provide around-the-clock patrol and services to the campus community. All Campus Public Safety officers are Commissioned in the state of KY as Special Local Peace Officers. They have arrest powers granted by KRS 61.266. Public Safety provides services to the University of Pikeville community, including an emergency response to medical emergencies, fire emergencies, and other emergencies. Public Safety enforces policies including those relating to alcohol use, drug use, and weapons possession. Public Safety officers submit incident reports on all crimes on campus reported to the department. Incident reports are filed and maintained within 24 hours of the incident. Vehicle and officer equipment stolen from campus are reported through the Pikeville Department to the National Crime Information Center (NCIC).

Describe the working relationship of campus security authority personnel with state and local law enforcement agencies:

The University of Pikeville has written mutual aid agreements with the Pikeville Police Department, Pike County Sheriff's Department, and the Kentucky State Police.

Section 2: Description of Information Programs

Describe programs that inform students and

(a) Campus safety and security

The University of Pikeville Department of Student Life publishes a Campus Safety Handbook that is distributed on campus and contains information of fire safety, threats, weapons possession, and sexual assault. An Emergency Response manual is published by Environmental Health and Safety office and distributed to each department on campus. The office of Student Life routinely holds informational meetings on safety topics. The University of Pikeville has an organized Safety Committee and works with each department on remedies of safety concerns or issues.

(b) How to report a crime:

The Campus Safety Handbook contains information on the proper procedure to contact Public Safety. Student Life publishes a list of fax numbers and telephone numbers for reporting emergencies and non-emergencies.

(c) How to prevent crimes:

The Chief of Public Safety during the beginning of the Fall Semester discusses personal safety with the students and raises awareness of rape, date rape, and forcible and non-forcible sexual offenses. The University community is given a Vehicle Information pamphlet and campus safety tips about locked doors, locked Residence Halls and rooms, and other safety tips. In the past invited the Kentucky State Police and the Pikeville City Police to come to campus to conduct seminars on personal safety. The University of Pikeville and the local law enforcement agencies are willing to help.

Section 3: Statements of Policies and Procedures

(a) Provide the institution's policy statement on making Special Reports to the campus community of crimes that present a safety or security threat to students or employees. KRS 164.049(1)

The University of Pikeville is dedicated to disseminating emergency and safety information to students, faculty and staff in a timely manner. In the event of a significant incident which the safety of the campus community seems to be in jeopardy, information will be made available through the University of Pikeville website as well as newspaper and person contact with those close to the incident. In the event of a non-identifiable or less than imminent threat, a "Campus Threat Notice" is issued which consists of publishing the specifics of the actual threat or incident. This information is disseminated through campus.

(b) If the institution provides student housing facilities, describe the institution's procedure for disclosing the existence or non-existence of automatic fire suppression systems in on-campus housing facilities. KRS 164.049

The University of Pikeville holds mandatory residence hall meetings at the beginning of each semester to inform students of fire safety and fire procedures. All of our residence halls have automatic fire suppression systems. In the event of a fire, all students are informed of these systems and the procedures they are to take in the event of an emergency.

(c) If the institution provides student housing facilities, provide the institution's policy giving students with disabilities priority for first floor housing. KRS 164.049(5)(1)

It is the policy of the University of Pikeville to provide rooms to those students with disabilities that are handicap accessible. Due to the design of our residence halls, these rooms may not always be on the ground floor. But they are designed handicap accessible to ensure their ease of ingress and egress even in an emergency.

(d) If the institution provides student housing facilities, describe the institution's policy regarding a record of any on-campus housing assignment for students with disabilities and the procedure for notifying security and emergency personnel at the home of students with disabilities. KRS 164.049(5)(2)

The policy of University of Pikeville Student Services is to provide a record to the Public Safety Department with housing assignments for each student. In the event of an emergency, the responding emergency personnel would be notified of those with physical disabilities by the responding police.
